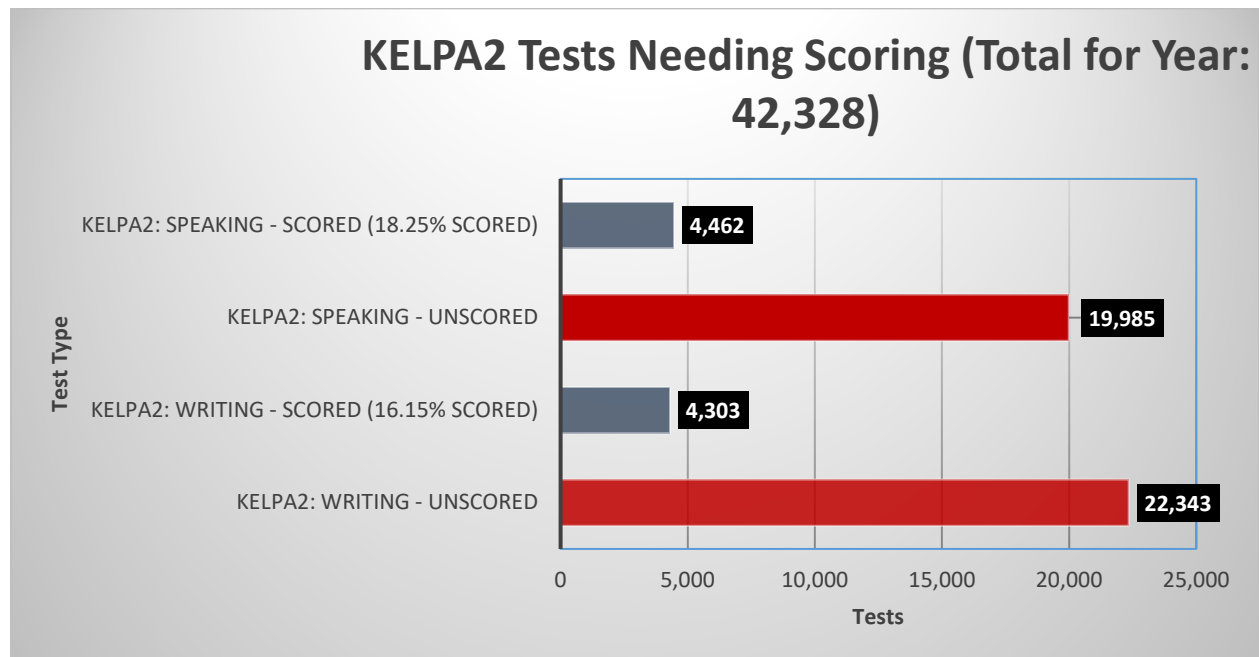

Are you ready for testing?

- Download Kite Student Portal
- Whitelisting – be sure you have completed this prior to testing – use www.ksassessments.org site to understand what needs to be completed before testing

TEST records for ELA, Math and Science:

- Should be submitted to KIDS by February 25
- Can be submitted at any point during testing, but you will need to allow 24 hours for the processing from KIDS to the Kite system to be in place.



Projected Testing Schedule for ELA, Math and Science:

- Please take time to enter your testing schedule in the Kite Educator Portal!
- The projected testing section of the **manage tests menu** provides assessment coordinators the ability to **view projected testing volume system wide** and to upload and manage their own testing schedule. It also helps manage testing volume at the state level

Test Readiness Extract

Provides – Student login, test records and PNP settings.

Usernames and Passwords

- Are the same for all KAP tests, including KELPA2.
- KAP tickets – back by popular demand
- KAP – Test Readiness Extract

Daily Access Codes (DAC):

- Are a unique code that allows students to launch each test in the Kite Student Portal.
- Are to be maintained as “secure” – DTCs are responsible for making sure secure transmission of these codes happens within their school district.
- Can be retrieved from **Educator Portal** beginning at 2:30 p.m. the day before testing day and the entire day of testing.

PNPs:

- Need to be entered in Educator Portal by February 25.
- New Abridged Extract for uploading PNPs
- Test Readiness Extract allows you to view all PNP

Braille tests: Have been sent to DTC around February 15.
