 - o If you have already completed this step, you do not need to do it again.



Personal Needs Profile Must be Complete

- Student's PNP must be completed before state assessment testing begins.
- Once testing begins, the PNP may not be changed/edited.
- If accommodations have not been added before testing, the student will test without the accommodations.





On-site Monitoring for State Assessments

- Purpose: To monitor test security, KSDE staff and members of the Kansas Assessment Advisory Council annually visit 5%–10% of Kansas schools during test administration.
- A representative sample of districts in Kansas across all state Board of Education regions, including both large and small districts – is selected for monitor visits.
- Kansas State Department of Education Test Security Guidelines



On-site Monitoring for State Assessments

- Two methods are used to conduct monitor visits:
- Schools and districts may *volunteer* to receive a monitor visit. A monitor team will be assigned to that district. The team will select the date they will conduct the visit based on the testing schedule provided by the school. The district will **not** be informed of the specific date selected.
- Other monitor visits are unannounced. A random sample of schools will be chosen from the list of districts and schools that did **not** volunteer. The DTC will be informed of potential visits and will share test schedules for the purpose of facilitating monitor visits.

KELPA Screener



- Reminder:
 - Add State Student Identifier (SSID) to KELPA Screener students
 - Connects Screener Student to TEST Enrollment Record
 - Retains KELPA Screener proficiency report associated with the SSID
 - Two ways to add the SSID
 - Manually: Settings > Screener Student > View Student > Edit
 - Upload/Link Student: Settings > Screener Student > Upload/Link Student > Upload updated KELPA Screener Student file







Rostered Prior Year Proficient

Screen Reader




- Students using a screen reader
 - Select Braille in the student PNP profile
 - Let Kite know that the student does not need a braille booklet sent to them for testing
 - KAPAccommodations@ku.edu
 - The test form assigned will be more compatible with external screen readers, making it easier for the student to access the content




PNP Upload



- PNP upload has been updated to match the manual process
- Is available only as an Excel sheet
- Each PNP option has a drop down with only the available option for the assessment
- To edit you will need to unprotect the sheet
 - Select Review > Unprotect Sheet







Interim - Interactive Reports

- N-value added to the Area Performance and Item Performance tabs
- N-value identifies the number of students who started the assessment in each group
 - o Roster, School, District, State
- Data now available for the Fall Interim

Spring Test Window



ELA/math

- Grades 3-8 and 10
- Must meet blueprint requirement in ELA and math assign testlets through instruction and assessment planner; access testlet information page through instruction and assessment planner.

Science

- Grades 5, 8, and 11
- Must test on all 9 Essential Elements testlets are assigned one at a time by the system; access testlet information page through test management instead of the instruction and assessment planner.

Special Circumstance Codes



- SC codes need to be entered for each subject
- Student must be rostered, first contact survey complete, and one testlet assigned before an SC code can be entered.
- Special Circumstance Codes for Kansas Districts (PDF)
- For SC-08 and SC-39 require the Special Circumstance Exemption Form completed and sent to chelsea.pelfrey@ksde.gov.

WorkKeys

Fall scoring is complete.

- All reports will be mailed and/or posted not later than January 31, 2025
- Refer to the Online Reports Portal User Guide to access reports through Validus.
- Spring testing
 - If you are testing on paper, submit the SDU to enroll your students. However if you did not do this before January 17, you will not receive barcode labels.
 - For online testing, enroll students through Validus, set up testing sessions and test January 29-April 21. Validus credentials will be sent to BTCs in two separate emails on January 29.



ACT



- Submit the SDU to enroll students. The SDU creates an order for paper testing if that is what you selected. If you did not enroll students before January 17, you will not receive barcode labels for paper testing.
- Create test sessions and assign students to sessions for online testing for Test Window 1 beginning January 27.
- Verify enrollment at least two weeks before the materials receipt date you chose.
