Added Changes to Remote Testing



- KAP Summative Remote Testing Manual
 - oTEST records submitted by March 14
 - 1 test session = 1 scheduled session with Monitor EDU
 - Teacher must schedule virtual meeting just prior to students testing.
 - Read scripts.
 - Reinforce security protocol.



2nd Grade Reading Assessment



- •Voluntary assessment for 2nd Grade
- Administered in Kite Student Portal
- Assess both skills and reading comprehension
- Based on state standards
- •2 sections, 30 minutes per section
- •Score reports available after window closes
- •TASC record to roster students



TTS Passages & Graphics Application Review Overview

KSDE reviewed 3038 applications

KSDE disapproved 779 applications

25.64% disapproval rate

Reasons for disapproval

- Incomplete form
- Question #1, 2, and 3 must be yes
- Question #4 Students IEP indicates they are only using a human reader; students IEP doesn't indicate they are using the accommodation for state assessments, classroom assessments, and classroom assignments
- Question #5 No Lexile data or Lexile is 500L or above
- PAR results all under 50% accuracy.



Test Coordinator Expectations

- The purpose of the signature at the bottom of the form is that the form should be reviewed for completeness and accuracy. This can be completed by any general or special education administrator or any test coordinator.
- This year we received several applications submitted on last year's form.
- We received several incomplete forms with no PAR results or PAR results where staff didn't follow the directions.
 - Start at the student's grade level and administer the Text Reader with the PAR passage. Record the percentage the student received on the comprehension questions after listening to the PAR text with a text reader. If the student's score was below 50%, move down grade levels until the student is able to perform at 50% or above. We have to be able to see that the student is benefiting from the accommodation when comparing to the Lexile level.
- As the DTC you should be reviewing the applications before submitting to KSDE. Please do not submit checklists that will obviously be disapproved, unless you intend to request SC-35.

Personal Needs Profile Must be Complete


- Student's PNP must be completed before state assessment testing begins.
- Once testing begins, the PNP may not be changed/edited.
- If accommodations have not been added before testing, the student will test without the accommodations.
- Per the 2024-2025 Kansas Assessment Program Overview all TTS Passages and Graphics must be marked by Feb. 26th at 5:00 pm
- If there are students that were disapproved and your team agrees the TTS Passages and Graphics accommodation is best for the student, you may email TTSpassages@ksde.gov the student's state ID number and use the special circumstance code SC-35. This will count against your school/district for participation.





Special Circumstance Codes



- Enter once the window opens but before the window closes.
- KSDE approval required for SC-08 and SC-39
- SC-08 and SC-39 change
 - o Email <u>chelsea.pelfrey@ksde.gov</u> for the form.



On-site Monitoring for State Assessments

- Purpose: To monitor test security, KSDE staff and members of the Kansas Assessment Advisory Council annually visit 5%–10% of Kansas schools during test administration.
- A representative sample of districts in Kansas across all state Board of Education regions, including both large and small districts – is selected for monitor visits.
- Kansas State Department of Education Test Security Guidelines



On-site Monitoring for State Assessments

- Two methods are used to conduct monitor visits:
- Schools and districts may *volunteer* to receive a monitor visit. A monitor team will be assigned to that district. The team will select the date they will conduct the visit based on the testing schedule provided by the school. The district will **not** be informed of the specific date selected.
- Other monitor visits are unannounced. A random sample of schools will be chosen from the list of districts and schools that did **not** volunteer. The DTC will be informed of potential visits and will share test schedules for the purpose of facilitating monitor visits.







Rostered Prior Year Proficient

- Requirements: Student Uploaded via TEST record for KELPA








Writing Booklets



- Required <u>only</u> for grade K and grade 1
- Writing booklets are found in the HELP tab in EP
 - KELPA Test Administration and Scoring Documents > select 2025
 Writing Test Administration and Scoring Directions
- Writing booklets must be submitted in the Surveys tab in EP before the end of the scoring window, which ends April 7th





Second Rater Scoring



- How do I see students marked for 2nd rater?
 - Select reports > Data Extracts > Select the Test Administration and Monitoring tab > Select "New file" in the Monitor Scoring row > Open the file and review column N (Rater). This column will state Secondary if the student is flagged as requiring 2nd rater scoring.



Second Rater Scoring Cont.



- How do I create an additional scoring assignment for a 2nd rater?
 - As a Building or District level user:
 - Scoring > Manage Scoring > Assign Scorers.
 Complete the required fields > Search > Select the students to be scored > select Add > Select the Scorer > select Add > select Save, and then select Done.
 - <u>Reminder</u>: Once a scoring assignment is created, manually it cannot be deleted. If it was created in error, there is no harm in leaving it in the system.





KELPA Screener



- Reminder:
 - o Add State Student Identifier (SSID) to KELPA Screener students
 - Connects Screener Student to TEST Enrollment Record
 - Retains KELPA Screener proficiency report associated with the SSID
 - Two ways to add the SSID
 - Manually: Settings > Screener Student > View Student > Edit
 - <u>Upload/Link Student</u>: Settings > Screener Student > Upload/Link Student > Upload updated KELPA Screener Student file

Screen Reader




- Students using a screen reader
 - Select Braille in the student PNP profile
 - Let Kite know that the student does not need a braille booklet sent to them for testing
 - KAPAccommodations@ku.edu
 - The test form assigned will be more compatible with external screen readers, making it easier for the student to access the content




PNP Upload



- PNP upload has been updated to match the manual process
- Is available only as an Excel sheet
- Each PNP option has a drop down with only the available option for the assessment
- To edit you will need to unprotect the sheet
 - Select Review > Unprotect Sheet








Instructional Mini Test Feedback



- Leave feedback on Instructional Mini Tests
 - Interim > Build a Tests
 - Your Feedback Allows users to leave feedback and view feedback you have already left on that test
 - All Feedback Displays feedback submitted by Kansas educators
 - Currently available for ELA and Science Instructional Mini Tests

Spring Test Window



ELA/math

- Grades 3-8 and 10
- Must meet blueprint requirement in ELA and math assign testlets through instruction and assessment planner; access testlet information page through instruction and assessment planner.

Science

- Grades 5, 8, and 11
- Must test on all 9 Essential Elements testlets are assigned one at a time by the system; access testlet information page through test management instead of the instruction and assessment planner.

Special Circumstance Codes



- SC codes need to be entered for each subject
- Student must be rostered, first contact survey complete, and one testlet assigned before an SC code can be entered.
- Special Circumstance Codes for Kansas Districts (PDF)
- For SC-08 and SC-39 require the Special Circumstance Exemption Form completed and sent to chelsea.pelfrey@ksde.gov.
